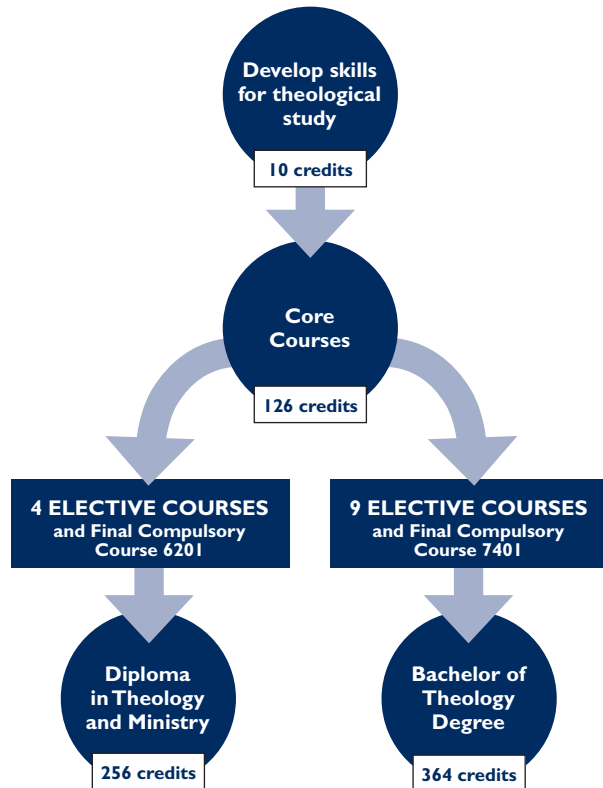

Registration must be on the correct TEEC registration forms and must be accompanied by payment. An original of a Matric Certificate is required for those registering for the degree. The following courses are completed by all students in both qualifications:

Note: 7 is the code number for BTh and 6 for DipThMin. After completing the Fundamental Course, you continue with the Core courses. Note the level of difficulty before choosing your course (See the back page for the recommended route.), then proceed to the Electives and in your final year of study do the Compulsory Course 6201 (Diploma students) or 7401 (Degree students).

FUNDAMENTAL COURSE:

Compulsory unless granted recognition of prior learning. May be taken in conjunction with other courses.

7/6000 • Developing skills for theological study: 10 credits.(Introductory) **All first year students begin with this course unless RPL has been granted.**

CORE COURSES:

Compulsory and to be completed, in any order, before the electives except for 6/7001. When the core is almost complete, electives may be included. The level of difficulty of courses is given in brackets.

7/6006 • Facilitating a Christian response to HIV/AIDS: 12 credits. (Intermediate) **May be taken with the Leadership course. Assessment dates are staggered.**

7/6002 • Engaging with people pastorally and ethically: 22 credits. (Introductory)

7/6003 • Growing spiritually, thinking theologically: 24 credits. (Introductory)

7/6004 • Interpreting texts: Biblical and other Christian sources: 30 credits. (Introductory) **This is a very large course and should be taken alone or with a smaller course.**

7/6005 • Practising Christian leadership and management: 12 credits. (Intermediate) **May be taken with the AIDS course. Assessment dates are staggered.**

7/6001 • Doing ministry for a change: 26 credits. (Advanced) This course should be taken towards the end of study.

The Elective courses are of your own choice and apply to both qualifications:

ELECTIVES: In order to gain a wide range of theological knowledge, skills and values a certain number of electives need to be taken in each stream.
