## note

Due to changes in Government legislation affecting Higher Education (Government Gazette No 30353), 2011 is the last year for new registrations on this 2 year programme. In 2012 it will be replaced by a 3 year Dip.Th. Students who are on the Dip.ThMin programme will be given the opportunity to either complete it, or to transfer to the new Diploma. The details of these options will only be available for the 2012 registration period.

# studying for ministry

If your TEEC studies are part of your training for ministry in your church, then please consult your denominational authorities for suggestions, recommendations or requirements regarding your study path. Also speak to your local minister about your studies as some of the courses will require you to do practical work in your local context.

## fees

The fees for the next academic year are published from 01 September. They are available on the College web site ([www.tee.co.za](http://www.tee.co.za)), are printed in the relevant yearbook, and can be e-mailed, posted, or faxed to you.

## how to register

Registration must be on the correct TEEC registration forms and must be accompanied by payment. Diploma registrations must be accompanied by a certified original Grade 12 or Standard 10 certificate. Registration forms and information on how to pay is available from 1 September. You are advised to register as soon after 1 October as you can to ensure that there are no delays. This will also give you maximum time to work through the material before writing assignments.

# Diploma in Theology and Ministry (Registered on the NQF at Level 6)

## The following courses are completed by all students:

After completing the Fundamental Course, you continue with the Core courses. Note the level of difficulty before choosing your course (See the back page for the recommended route.), then proceed to the Electives and in your final year of study do the Compulsory Course 6001 Doing Ministry for a Change.

### FUNDAMENTAL COURSE:

Compulsory unless granted recognition of prior learning. May be taken in conjunction with other courses.

**6000** • Developing skills for theological study: 10 credits. (Introductory) **All first year students begin with this course unless RPL has been granted.**

### CORE COURSES:

Compulsory and to be completed, in any order, before the electives except for 6001. When the core is almost complete, electives may be included. The level of difficulty of courses is given in brackets.

**6002** • Engaging with people pastorally and ethically: 22 credits. (Introductory)

**6003** • Growing spiritually, thinking theologically: 24 credits. (Introductory)

**6004** • Interpreting texts: Biblical and other Christian sources: 30 credits. (Introductory) **This is a very large course and should be taken alone or with a smaller course.**

**6005** • Practising Christian leadership and management: 12 credits. (Intermediate) **May be taken with the AIDS course. Assessment dates are staggered.**

**6006** • Facilitating a Christian response to HIV/AIDS: 12 credits. (Intermediate) **May be taken with the Leadership course. Assessment dates are staggered.**

**6001** • Doing ministry for a change: 26 credits. (Advanced) This course can only be taken during your last year of study.

## The Elective courses are of your own choice:

**ELECTIVES:** In order to gain a wide range of theological knowledge, skills and values, a certain number of electives need to be taken in each stream.
