

TEEC Is a distance learning college which provides theological education for Christians involved in lay and ordained ministries in all of the major denominations. Students from all denominations are welcome to study with us. Studying by extension enables you to study at home and in your own local church and community context.

Courses are provided at Award, Certificate, Diploma and Degree levels. Leaflets for the other programmes of study are available from TEEC. All of our courses are in line with the South African Government's recommendations regarding Outcomes Based Education and Training.

Special Focus Studies

Each course (not topic) costs the same as a Certificate course. You may study at your own pace. Once all four courses are successfully completed, apply to College for your specially prepared Special Focus Certificate.

Any Certificate course which you have already passed can be used towards one of the Special Focus Study topics, as long as the course fits the topics. We also encourage you to take additional certificate courses and gain the full certificate.

Assessment usually includes both written submissions and practical work and varies from course to course. It may include written assignments (some with a practical component), projects and examinations.

We recommend that you take no more than two or three courses at a time.

Now you can take 4 courses on a particular topic and get a TEE Special Focus Certificate to show for it. All results will be recorded at TEE and can be credited towards further Special Focus Studies or the full Certificate. Choose from the following:-

Know your Bible

Certificate courses required: Introduction to the Old Testament, Introduction to the New Testament, one Old Testament book, one New Testament book.

Care for People

Certificate courses required: Introduction to Pastoral Care and Counselling, The Church's Response to AIDS, Christian Ethics, Spirituality.

Preach your Faith

Certificate courses required: Introduction to the Old Testament, Introduction to the New Testament, Christian Doctrine 1, Preaching.

Spirituality: the broad picture

Certificate courses required: Spirituality, Introduction to the New Testament, Christian Doctrine 1, Early Church History.

Know your Christian Context

Certificate courses required: Early Church History, South African Church History, Christian Doctrine 1, Christian Doctrine 2

Live your Faith

Certificate courses required: Spirituality, Christian Ethics, Christian Doctrine 1, Call to Discipleship

201: Introduction to the Old Testament

This course is an introduction to the Old Testament which covers the history and background of the Bible and a basic survey of the books of the Old Testament. It should be taken before any other courses on single Old Testament books.

221: Introduction to the New Testament

This course introduces you to Palestine in the time of Jesus, to biblical criticism and to the New Testament books.

241: Christian Doctrine 1

This course is an introduction to what Christians believe about God, themselves and the world in which they live.

242: Christian Doctrine 2

251: Early Church History

This course introduces you to the story of Christianity from the time of the New Testament to the year 500. It will help you to understand how the early Christians worshipped and what they believed.

253: South African Church History

This course introduces you to the story of Christianity in Southern Africa from 1652 to the present day. It covers the major missionary denominations and the African Independent Churches.

266: Christian Ethics

Ethics is the study of right and wrong and this course will help you to make moral decisions based on Christian principles and basic human justice.

270: Call to Discipleship

272: Preaching

This course looks at the preparation, writing and delivery of sermons which are relevant to the real life situations of the congregation.

274: Introduction to Pastoral Care and Counselling

This course is an introduction to the listening skills required to help those in need. Please note that this course does not qualify you to become a professional counsellor.

276: Spirituality: Walking closer with Jesus

This course will help you to grow in your own experience of prayer by introducing you to a variety of ways of praying. You will also study the Holy Spirit, grace and the sacraments.

278: The Church's Response to AIDS

This course covers the causes and effects of AIDS and explores some of the theological questions around this issue. It is a practical course which will enable you to be involved in AIDS ministry.

OLD TESTAMENT BOOKS

212: Amos

Book 1 offers a general introduction to the prophets. Book 2 is a study of Amos in his context and includes justice issues.

213: Genesis

This course introduces you to the context and significance of the book of Genesis. You will study the whole book of Genesis a section at a time.

214: Exodus

This course introduces you to the context and significance of the book of Exodus. You will study the whole book of Exodus a section at a time.

215: Psalms

This course is a study of each Psalm which looks at the theme and offers notes on individual verses and on the use of the Psalm.

NEW TESTAMENT BOOKS

232: 1 Corinthians

This course covers 1 Corinthians section by section offering an outline, notes and interpretation of each.

234: Romans

This course covers Romans section by section offering an outline, notes and interpretation of each.

235: Philippians

This course covers Philippians section by section offering an outline, notes and interpretation of each.
